The Committee considers the Act is generally working well. The new legislation will make it easier for communities to have their say in alcohol regulation in their area. This should assist the Committee gain a greater understanding of the alcohol-related harm impacts on local communities.

14 What changes or trends in licensing have you seen since the Act came into force?report:

There appears to be a general increase in public interest in premises through public objection process. This may result in a greater number of hearings but this has not occurred yet.

15 What changes to practices and procedures under the Act (if any) would you find

### beneficial?report:

The Committee considers that a statutory Alternative Dispute Resolution option, (ie mediation), should be in the Act.
