

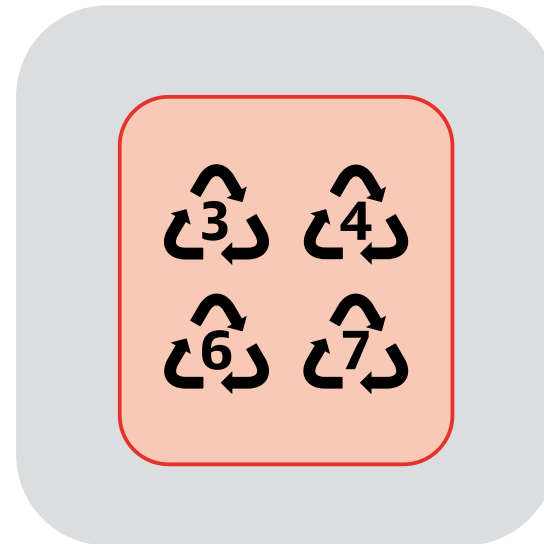
Rubbish

✓ What can go in the rubbish bin?

Household rubbish that cannot be recycled or reused, including:



General rubbish



Plastics with no number or a number 3, 4, 6 or 7

✗ No:

- Liquids
 - Ashes or inflammable material
 - Hazardous waste
 - Batteries
- ✗ No more than 10% garden waste

Please wrap sharp objects

✓ What can be recycled in Wellington City?

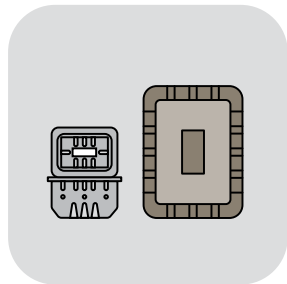
Items must be loose, not in a bag.

Plastic

Numbers 1, 2, and 5, grocery packaging only, such as:



Drink and milk bottles

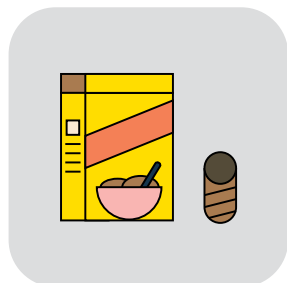


Food containers and meat trays

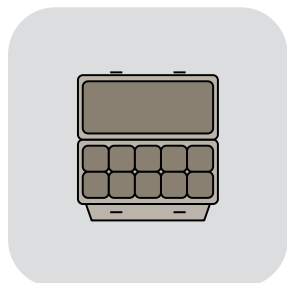


Bottles and containers from your bathroom, kitchen or laundry

Paper and cardboard



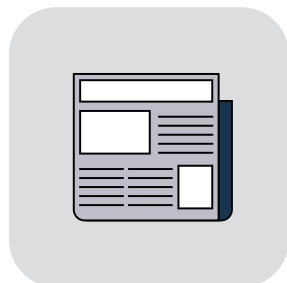
Cereal boxes & toilet paper rolls



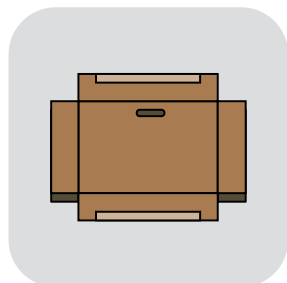
Egg cartons



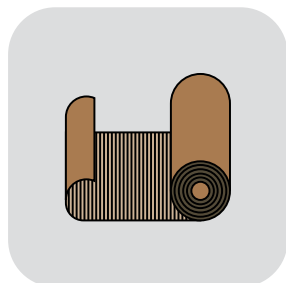
Office paper & envelopes



Domestic junk mail, newspapers & magazines

Includes pizza boxes (remove scraps & cheese residue)



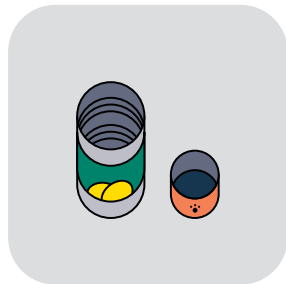
Brown corrugated cardboard

Tins and cans

Clean and not squashed, with lids removed.



Aluminium drinking cans



Steel food & pet food tins

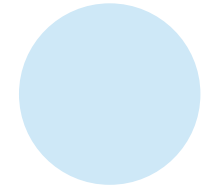
✗ No:

- Plastic numbers 3, 4, 6 or 7, or plastics with no number
- Items smaller than a credit card
- Containers larger than 3 litres
- Lids, including triggers & pumps
- Soft plastics and bags
- Polystyrene
- Tetra Paks
- Non-grocery plastics (like toys)
- Aerosols
- Food or items still containing food
- Coffee cups
- Compostable packaging
- Glass

If in doubt, leave it out

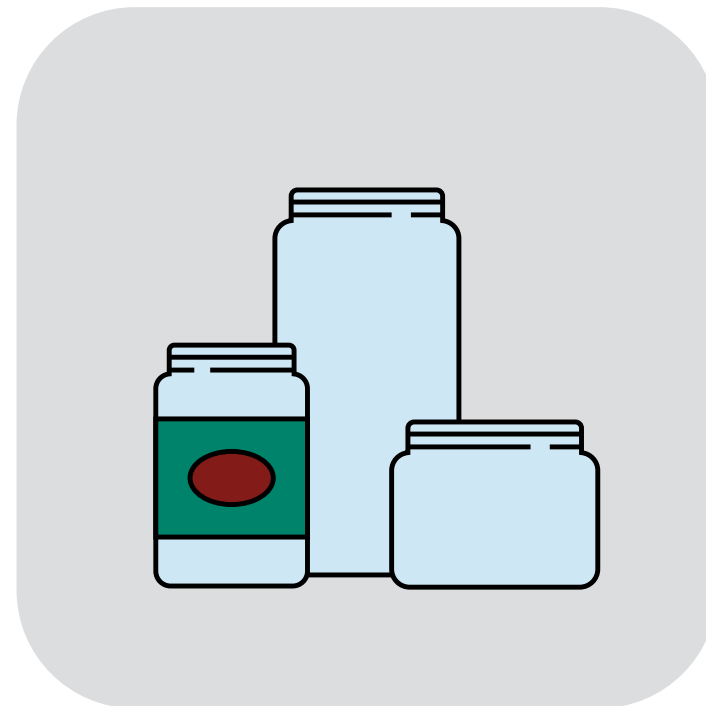

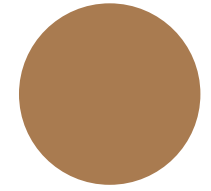

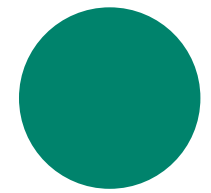
