Submission on the WCC Long Term Plan - May 2021

Context

Reminder of the benefits of the Great Harbour Way

- Few places in the world that have this opportunity to create a continuous route that connects the ocean, harbour, our cities and our history.
- Significant tourism drawcard, huge health and active transport benefits.
- Submission to 3 Councils and other key stakeholders to deliver on these benefits.

Achievements to date

- Te Aranui o P\u00f6neke / Great Harbour Way is now a well known concept.
- WCC work on Cobham Drive and the Evans Bay to Oriental Bay routes.
- Consent and funding for the Ngauranga-Petone seaside and Eastern Bays shared paths.

Our Submission

 The Long Term Plans for WCC, HCC, and GWRC needs to factor in further investment to realise the vision of the Great Harbour Way, and the investment in Te Ara Tupua, Cobham Drive and Oriental Bay routes.





What we can achieve

- A significant tourism and recreation attraction; making Wellington and the wider region a destination to stay longer and spend more.
- Encouraging more people to walk, cycle and explore our harbour.
- Making it safe to do so for families with small children, elderly people and those with disabilities.
- Showing our ingenuity to create separated paths and closer connections to the harbour.
- Enabling a spine connecting other walking and cycling opportunities like the Remutaka trail.
- Having the route used for ultra-marathons, school trips, and other recreational events.
- Resulting in significant health benefits for our people and financial benefit for our city.
- Providing places where we bring people close to nature and in touch with our indigenous stories.





Investments required as part of the Long Term Plan



South coast / Seatoun

- Establish separated cycling and walking paths, or widen the shared footpath, or where this is not possible;
- Reduce traffic speed, giving priority to people on bikes.
- Remove pinch points.
- Include opportunities to protect the shoreline from the effect of climate change.
- Signage to show the start / end for the Great Harbour Way, and to provide information about our cultural history and heritage.

Miramar Peninsula

- Urgently work with the Great Harbour Way Trust, other stakeholders and the Shelly Bay developers to come up with a plan to make the route around the Peninsula safe including during the development at Shelly Bay.
- Look at innovative options like boardwalks to separate walkers, or a one way lane between Shelly and Scorching Bay to free up a lane for cyclists and walkers.
- Create places where people can explore the seashore.



Investments required as part of the Long Term Plan



Evans-Oriental Bay, Wellington waterfront

- Continue with the great work started on the Oriental Bay separated cycle and walkways.
- Encourage commuter cyclists and scooterists away from the waterfront promenade; providing alternatives such as a bike lane along Jervois Quay.
- Signage promoting the whole of the Te Aranui o P\u00f3neke route.

CBD to Ngauranga Connection

- Fully back improvements to make Thorndon Quay safer for walkers and cyclists alike.
- Work with Centreport to ensure a top class walking and cycling connection to the new ferry terminal from both the CBD and Ngauranga.
- Widen the Hutt Road shared path and provide safer pedestrian & cyclist crossings at Ngauranga Interchange.



In summary

- Include the investment in the Great Harbour Way / Te Aranui o P\u00f6neke as part of the Long Term Plan.
- Work with the HCC, GWRC and other stakeholders to collectively realise the vision of the Great Harbour Way and its substantial benefits over the next few years.
- Reference the <u>detailed written submission</u> that we have provided to each of the Councils as well as the excellent <u>Boffa Miskell report</u> produced back in 2009 that highlights the issues and opportunities for the Great Harbour Way.
- Make sure that this Long Term Plan provides an excellent future for our whanau and tamariki, gifting them the amazing asset that the Te Aranui O Poneke will be.
