086/10C PRESENTATION OF ABSOLUTELY POSITIVELY WELLINGTON AWARD (1215/11/IM)

Mayor Prendergast presented the APW Award to Neil Plimmer of Wellington Sculpture Trust, and gave the following speech.

"APW awards are a way for the Council to honour members of our community who have made major contributions in various fields over a long period.

It is my pleasure today to present the Absolutely Positive Wellingtonian award to a Wellingtonian who has done an enormous amount to promote public art in our city.

Neil Plimmer had a distinguished career as a diplomat and public servant before he found the time to join the Wellington Sculpture Trust on his "socalled" retirement.

Since then he has been an inspirational figure, providing essential continuity between the founding trustees and the present board, especially when he took over from founding chairman, Ian Prior. Wellington Sculpture Trust was established in 1982 to raise funds for the installation of Tanya Ashken's "Albatross" by Frank Kitts Park, and in the hope of being able to commission more work.

The story since then is quite extraordinary. Starting with the exciting and ground-breaking Sculpture Walk in the Botanic Gardens, the sculpture habit spread downtown through Lambton Quay.

Over the years it moved further around the waterfront, and on to the recently completed Meridian series on Cobham Drive. In fact, since 2000 more than 20 permanent public artworks have been installed through the trust.

Whether it's day or night, fine or stormy, these strange shapes and objects invite a closer look as you walk through town or the gardens, and reward a passing glimpse if you are driving to the Airport or the eastern suburbs. Some change shape, light up or make a noise – responding to the wind, reflecting the mood of our vigorous elements. Wellington is a city for sculpture. This is the tag-line of Wellington Sculpture Trust and the title of the recent book published by the trust and Victoria University Press, but it is no mere rhetoric. Public art on this scale can only succeed when there is close interaction between all parties, clearly including local people. Wellington has succeeded in this.

Jonathan Milne, of the Learning Connexion, said in an interview just last week that public sculpture is one of the delights of Wellington. "The Wellington Sculpture Trust has supported art which somehow belongs to the city," he said.

"Wellington has transformed from a grey, civil service town to an immensely engaging place which is, among other things, an open art gallery."

Many would agree – and we as a community owe enormous thanks to all those who have worked with and on the trust. However, Neil Plimmer's personal role has been critical.

His energy is unflagging and his commitment total. And his skills, which make him so effective as a chairman, strategist and advocate for public sculpture, have made the difference in so many major projects.

There are legal, financial, artistic and temperamental minefields on all sides of an enterprise like this. People in the arts have strong views. They certainly don't often like the same things!

Chairing a group of such "artistic" devotees, and liaising with a host of property developers, philanthropists, corporate sponsors and council officers would require the wisdom of Solomon.

So clearly Neil's career in New Zealand's diplomatic service didn't hurt. Public sculpture is contemporary art at the cutting edge. The timeframe for a project can rely on new inventions to achieve the artist's vision – for example scouring the world for concrete to be poured round LED lighting. One example of the commitment of Neil and his team relates to the preparations for the opening of the "Subject To Change" sculpture on Karo Drive, by Regan Gentry.

The day before, Neil and a couple of members of the trust board didn't just pull a few weeds from the site – they took three trailer loads of rubble to the tip.

In his diplomatic career and his time in tourism, Neil came to know many world cities well. He wondered how Wellington might compare and even compete. What do we have that's truly unique?

That was one reason he channelled his creative interests into public art, and sculpture in particular.

It's risky to take art out of the gallery and into the world, with its big spaces and robust public commentary – especially when public money is at stake.

The trust's, and Neil's, relationship-building with project partners and sponsors is a large part of a soundly professional financial story. The relationship with Wellington City Council in particular has been of huge importance. It's a relationship of trust that has been built up through shared vision and shared tasks over many years to the benefit of the whole city.

Finally, the good news is that this is not another retirement speech. Neil's perennial youthfulness and openness to new ideas will hopefully be available to the city for a long while yet. Neil, on behalf of the Council and the city, I would like to thank you all for your efforts and congratulate you on your achievements.

You truly are an Absolutely Positive Wellingtonian and I look forward to seeing more great ideas from Wellington Sculpture Trust take shape around the harbour, hills and streets of our city."

 - (f) The project must have the School Board of Trustees and school management written support.
 - (g) Any trust or management arrangement for the project must be legally constituted and have adequate skills in planning, governance and management.
 - (h) The project must have a Formal Use and Licence to Occupy Agreement in place with the Ministry of Education.
 - (i) The project must have an appropriate business and asset management plan in place which ensures that no additional operational or capital funding would be sought from the Wellington City Council.
 - (j) Projects will only be able to be funded once through the Pools Partnership Fund.
 - (k) The applicant must agree to provide an annual report to the Wellington City Council on the operation, maintenance, and achievements of the pool. This report will need to be provided throughout the indicated life of the asset, as defined prior to construction, and will include statements on schools programmes, community access, and operation of the asset.
