NIGHT PATROL

27 Volunteer Members

- Shifts:
 - Thursday: 1800-2100hrs.
 - Friday 1800-0000hrs (2 patrols).
 - Saturday 1800-0000hrs (2 patrols).
- Typical Shift:
 - Logged on with Police (2+ patrollers on duty).
 - Intelligence-led patrols.
 - Patrols focused on crime prevention, public safety and taskings.
 - Assist members of the public.



DAY PATROL

13 Volunteer Members

- Weekday shifts – morning and afternoon.
- Weekly rosters for increased flexibility.
- Typical Shift:
 - Logged on with Police (2+ patrollers on duty).
 - Intelligence-led patrols.
 - Patrols focused around railways stations, schools and shopping areas.
 - Engagement with business owners and the public.
