Transpower New Zealand limited ('**Transpower**') wishes to be a party to an appeal by The Royal Forest and Bird Protection Society of New Zealand Incorporated ('the **Appellant**') against the decisions of Wellington City Council (the '**Respondent**') on the Proposed Wellington City District Plan ('**PDP**') (ENV-2025-WLG-000015).

2 Transpower:

- a Is a person who has an interest in the proceedings that is greater than the interest that the general public has. This is because Transpower is the State-Owned Enterprise that plans, builds, maintains and operates New Zealand's National Grid, and the Appellant's relief includes amendments to provisions that relate to these functions; and

 - b Amendments sought to the INF Chapter Objectives;
 - c Amendments sought to INF-P6;
 - d Amendments sought to apply the CE Chapter to all infrastructure in the coastal environment;
 - e Amendments sought to apply the ECO Chapter to all infrastructure;
 - f Amendments sought to apply the NFL Chapter to all infrastructure;
 - g Amendments sought to the INF-NG Subchapter Introduction;

- h Amendments sought to the INF-NG Subchapter Policies;
- i Amendments sought to the INF-NG Subchapter Rules; and
- j Additional rules sought in the ECO Chapter relating to vegetation works outside of a Significant Natural Area ('SNA').
- Transpower has set out its position in relation to the above provisions and its reasons in **Appendix A** to this notice.
